The Summer Reading Program at the Knoxville Public Library "is designed to inspire and engage readers of all ages through a diverse array of artistic expressions." The Summer Reading Program is off and running at the library! All patrons from babies to children to teens to adults have picked up their summer reading logs. The children's reading logs ask that kids read for 30 min a day for 30 days to get a prize at the end of the summer.
